Westlink Remodel and Expansion

This spring, the Westlink Branch (8515 Bekemeyer) will move to a temporary location (southeast corner of Central and Ridge). The almost 40-year-old building and busiest branch library is undergoing a major remodel and expansion. The renovation will double its size, add community meeting and collaboration rooms, expand the children's section, add a drive-up window, and provide updated technology, furniture, and amenities. Completion is anticipated in spring 2024.
